This was at the end of Stephen Brown's time as owner and just before the beginning of a period of tenancy by various gentlemen and senior officers in the military, including Cpt Fitzroy Wilson and Major John Radcliffe. Lt Col William Marsden also lived there in 1891 until his father's executor/trustees sold to Dr Edward Liveing Fenn, the last family owner of the house.
